State of the Hitters Address- Usage is the biggest issue this year. We restocked some talent and cover all our games, sometimes with a bad card. There will be a limitation on the pinch-hitting and defensive replacements. There is no PH cardboard nor a fielding one on the bench. Sometimes a bad shift will just have to hit.

Catcher- Very tight this year. Only 174 games. The Catcher that starts finishes. I expect Wynn to bunt a lot.

1B – First base is another hot mess. **Pasquantitno** has only 61 games. **Rowdy “Kung Poa” Tellez** returns home to plays the majority of games (108). Whoever starts finishes

2B- Mookie Betts will slide in to 2B this year with 152 games. **Johnathan India** former ROY, will probably pickup the remain 10 games in Nov.

SS- Calros Correa/Santiago Espinal cover more than enough games. Since there won’t be a great PH option on the bench, I expect whoever starts to go the distance

3B- Chris Morel will play all of his 107 games at the hot corner. **Espinal** and **Senzel** will cover the rest based on matchup. There is no defensive replacement

OF- The outfield has a number of players. Center field will be covered by **Ian Happ**. Right field will be split between **Will Benson** against righthanders and **Johan Rojas (RF)** against lefties. Left field **Jazz Chisholm** and **Corey Julks** will split time with one filling it at DH. Depending on how the season goes **Conforto** may get some time here or battle Tellez for the pork strips.

DH- Shohei Ohtani is full time DH. He should never come out. But he does miss 27 games. Since the repeal of the Ohtani rule, which only affects Ohtani, when he starts, he won’t DH. The plan is for **Jazz Chisholm** to make-up games at DH but **Senzel, McKinney, India** and others will probably fill in as well.

Pitching



Starters: Another year another spaghetti western. There is the good, the bad and the ugly. The Good- 134 starts of 8 or better, including 48 of 13 or better. The Bad- 12 starts of grade 6-7. The Ugly- 16 starts of Alex Wood. At least he has a 26 HR rating.

There will be a few openers starting but we would like to get a minimum of 5 out of the real starters. If trailing by more than 4 runs, leave them in until pounded out. There are plenty of innings, we shouldn't lose a game because the starter was left in too long.

Shohei Ohtani (RH 18) – only 23 starts. If we're leading by a comfortable margin can go through a 2nd reduction before being replaced. Just don't put the game at risk

Tanner Biebee (RH 13), Chris Sanchez (RH 11), Johan Oviedo (RH 10) and Trevor Rogers-XC (LH 10) – 79 more games we want 5 out of this bunch and hopefully 6. If necessary to protect a lead go to the pen.

Steven Matz (LH 8), Louie Varland (RH 9), Sean Manaea (LH 7)- 37 mediocre starts. I'm hoping to get the best out of this bunch and get 5 IP. These guys also provide relief innings and will be used out of the pen. Check the schedule to see if they are starting

Alex Wood (LH 3/13*) – Will make too many starts. He should chew up as many innings as we can but if we're close in the 5th yank him.

The Openers- Okert (2 GS), McGill (2 GS), and Staumant (1 GS), are playing openers for a few games. Hopefully will get through 2-3 innings, max 3 before hitting the pen.

Relievers: An actual bullpen. We even have defined roles. Lots of innings but will require some diligence as may reliever innings are also owned by starters. They are, of course, also wild. What's a Melrose pen without some Ws?

- As a general rule a reliever should not pitch more than 2 IP per appearance, this is not a hard rule because we do have some starters that are openers and with low fatigue



Lucas Simes (RH 21)- is the primary closer. He can pitch 1.1 IP per game and 2.2 IP per series

Kirby Yates (RH 20)- not only setup but I like him to come in as early as 6 to put out a rally. 1.1 IP per game and 2.2 IP per series

Tanner Scott (LH 17)- Good perphs (+16/+51). Lots of innings. Can close if lots of LH shifts. Can pitch 2 IP per game and 4 IP per series. Rally killer 6th or later.

Group B- Jacob Webb (RH 15), Alex Wood (LH 13), Steven Okert (LH 11), Daniel Palencia (RH12) and Sean Manaea (LH 11) - Middle guys. Heavily LH and some of them are part-time starters. These are 5th -7th inning guys as needed. 158 innings total. Wood spend ½ the season in the rotation so can pitch often out of the pen when not starting.

Group C- Nick Ramirez (RH 10), Trevor Megill (RH 9), Steven Matz (LH 8), Louie Varland (RH 8) and - 113 innings of primarily decent RH pitchers that can be used early or to offset a LH killer if group A is up. **Matz** and **Varland** are primarily starters and should not be used when in the rotation.

MopUp- When up, **Rafael Montero (RH5)** will be bulk innings when score is out of hand. Can be used 3IP per appearance.



Note: **Alex Wood** makes a lot of starts but has lost of relief innings as well. Can be used often when not starting and stay in longer. He follows and opener and can pitch 3.1 innings, or more if big lead.

Strategy

Offense: Lots of potential but needs another year to fit together well. Not a lot of extra usage and some bad shifts will just have to try their best. There is little in the way of PH. On the bright side we do have more speed.

Stealing:

- Melrose has some base stealers this year. Use the following limits
 - **Chisolm, Benson, Ohtani, Morel, Rojas, Julks**- 2/Series
 - **Betts, Happ, India** - 1/series
 - **Everyone Else** can use a steal, if available 7th or later winning or tying run on 1st.
- With the exception of **Everyone Else**, steals can take place as early as 4th

Hit & Run: Lots of batters have 2-31s. I like to use H&R especially against + control pitchers.

- Eligible runner SSN >=24
- Batter has 2- 31's

Sacrifice:

- I expect Wynn to sac a lot.
- Since no PH Manager's discretion on using the SAC

Runner Advancement: **Be Aggressive, especially with 2 outs! Lots of fast runners**

Boards: Use Adams table

Computer:
Go when runner is well around bag
2 out F runner on second send them home
1 out F runner on third send them home
F runner on third <2 out on Fly Ball arm <=30 send runner
Runner on 2nd, ball hit to CF or RF arm <=31 send runner

Infield:

- <2 out tying or winning run on third 7th inn or later infield should play in. Infield plays back all other times.
- Always hold runner on 1st adjusted SSN > 14. Don't hold N's
- Pitch from stretch if runner on third is eligible to steal home SSN >15 7th or later
