No electronic gamesheets necessary from computer managers. Please play the games personally with your computer without using a computer manager.

These lineups will likely never be used as I will send monthly lineups dependent upon whom your starting pitcher will be. Diaz and Grandal can be pinch run for in the $8^{\text {th }}$ or later of any game that is $+/-1$ run; Robles runs and then the other catcher plays the rest of the game. Schmitt becomes the 3B-3 against RHP if Lewis is not rostered in any given month. Larnach can pinch hit in the ninth for Massey, Schmitt, or Escobar if an XB hit gives Dawgs a chance to tie or take the lead.

## Midwest on Offense

The arms fell off on most of my starting pitchers from last year, and that means we have some offense but little chance of winning consistently this season. We are going to try to be competitive, but winning will depend on outhitting your team
Hit and Run: Almost everyone can steal a base this year, so let's play hit and run as much as we can. Best time is when Grisham, Massey, Mullins, Robles, Rodriguez, or Taylor are on first and any two-31 hitter is at the plate. Generally speaking, H-R when the Mongrels are +/-2 runs, less than two outs, and one of the better starting pitchers or double digit reliever is pitching for the Dawgs-in other words, when it is cost effective to take the chance. Don't waste possible CS when yucky starters are pitching, unless they get a grade advancement and show that this day might make it worth while.
Bunt: After a lead off double with any hitters except Schwarber, Rodriguez, Larnach, Lewis, or Crawford. Let's not suicide on the road this season-way too many 13s on these cards.
Stolen Base: Julio Rodriguez can steal a base per series on a straight steal. The should be $+/-1$ run; otherwise use the hit and run instead if it is in play.
Runner Advance: Only if runner is "well around" for you computer players. For MG players, use Adams table.
Everything else: Use your judgment and play my team as you would your own. Roll the dice and enjoy the games without stressing about what I would do. Things are what they are this year, and my draft picks are going to other teams, so there is really little I am playing for other than the pride of winning as many games as simply as possible.

## Midwest on Defense

This is a strong defensive team this season. Most players have plenty of games, so the bench will seldom be used from game to game. Diaz and Grandal are the slowest runners, so you can pinch run for either one of them (using Robles if rostered, anyone with better speed if he is not) in the $8^{\text {th }}$ or later to tie the game or take the lead. The other catcher then comes in to play the rest of the game. Other than that, no need to pinch hit or change things up defensively.

As for game situations, generally speaking play my team as you would your own. Here are some things to consider as you play the games:

I still hate the infield in play. If score is $+/-2$ runs, play infield deep with zero or one out. If the score is tied, play the infield in for those situations; but if you DO score and there is still a runner on third base, go back to playing deep.

Let your runners take an extra base if the final valuation number is greater than 28. Make the throw if it is 28 or less. Generally do not make the throw to attempt to catch the trailing runner. IF you are unsure what to do, play my team as you would your own if it were in the field. Use the Adams chart if you need special support for your decisions based on number of outs versus score differential. Again, emphasis is on having fun instead of following these instructions to the letter of the law.

Catchers always make the throw to try to stop a stolen base unless your advance number totals $\mathbf{3 6}$ or higher.

## Midwest Pitching

The bullpen is adequate, but it is short in quality innings, and short in general given how many really bad starts I will have this season. In general, apply the pen aggressively as outlined below when I have a chance to win-let's define that as within three runs after six innings. Otherwise, look for opportunities to preserve the better relievers by using those middle grade men to finish off games. Seabold is on the roster with 87 innings and no grade bump to help preserve innings-he can replace a starter who is pounded out of the game, or he can pitch the last several innings if the Dawgs trail by five or more runs.

Please follow these rules carefully in order to insure that I have enough relief.

1. Every starter goes 5 innings unless pounded out of the game. Staple those bad starters to the mound for as long as they can last.
2. If the starter gets pounded out, enter Seabold for up to $\mathbf{2 - 2 / 3}$ innings to preserve the other relievers.
3. Muller and Whitlock never relieve-they are starters only.
4. For all usage for the rest of the relievers consult the chart on the next page.

Extra innings are the enemy!! <br> At any point, if you are unable to fit the game situation to these descriptions, you are on your own to make your best decision possible. I am considering ways to increase my relief innings using the waiver wire and/or September trades and will address the issue as I can later. |
